

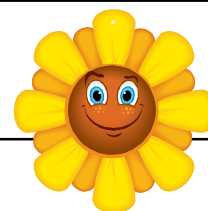


Headteacher's Commendation

If the prescription requires the medicine to be given **four** times a day, Mrs Burgess is able to oblige, although in these cases the child should probably be kept at home anyway. Thank you.
